What we will do

The RAi UK Health and Social Care Working Group will focus on several key activities over the next few years:

1. **Assessing AI Adoption:** Evaluate the current state of AI adoption in health and social care in the UK, identifying barriers to effectiveness and contributions to inequities.
2. **Mapping the Ecosystem:** Understand the surrounding ecosystem and necessary skills to accelerate AI uptake.
3. **Priority Identification:** Refine initial assessments to prioritise and meet areas of greatest need and impact.
4. **Delivering Comprehensive Outputs:**
 - Develop a map of deployable AI products in health and social care
 - Produce reports and white papers on the responsible and trustworthy deployment of AI, including recommended reporting standards
 - Develop skills courses for the health and care workforce
 - Develop and grow a network of AI Champions to support and advocate for responsible AI use in healthcare.
5. **Stakeholder Engagement:** Proactively engage with sector-wide stakeholders through workshops, roundtables, and other collaborative events, to ensure all voices are heard.
